Class of 2015	2 Lay Members	(3-year term)

Those elected at the 2010 Convention will be expected to attend these meetings: **November 9-11, 2012**, Planning Retreat at Ascension School; and

2013 meetings held bi-monthly beginning in January or the first weekend in February; and

2013 Diocesan Convention tentatively set for Ontario, Oregon, October 11-13, 2013.

*TO BECOME A CANDIDATE FOR THESE POSITIONS:* (1) Read the DUTIES (for Diocesan Council or Standing Committee) on the attached sheet.

(2) request a CANDIDATE FORM from the person in charge of your congregation or from the Diocesan Office. **Submit completed and copy ready candidate forms to the Diocesan Office by August 28, 2012**, for reproduction in the Pre-Convention Journal. CANDIDATE FORM may be submitted by email, by standard mail, or by fax. Nominations will be accepted following August 28, but information about the candidate will not be published. Announcement of those nominations will be made from the floor of Convention prior to elections.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Qualification for candidacy for lay positions is "*confirmed adult communicants in good standing of some congregation in canonical union with the Diocese.*" An "*adult*" is defined as 16 years of age and older. Nominations of persons who have not served at the Diocesan level are highly encouraged. Anyone interested in these positions is encouraged to submit a Candidate Form. Attendance at the 2012 Diocesan Convention is not required of candidates but can be conducive to election.
