VIDEOTAPES

I. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION for Adults and Children

Acts of the Apostles: Glimpses of the Early Church. A twelve part study series on Acts, bringing to life the spirit, conflict and major events in the birth of the infant church. Six tapes, each with two segments of 40-50 minutes each. These lectures are by the Rev. John Stone Jenkins, whom many of you enjoyed in "Hebrew Roots, Christian Beginnings".

Adult Education Camp 1990 Jim Kelsey and Tom Ray from the Diocese of Northern Michigan present ideas on Mutual Ministry, growing churches and developing ministries. Recorded during sessions at Ascension School. 5 tapes; approx. 2 hrs. each.

***The Anglican Way of Life. DVD, 52 minutes. Episcopal priest and educator John Westerhoff presents the tradition and roots of Anglicanism and the Episcopal Church. Exploring 'who we are' regarding our identity, authority, spirituality and temperament, he begins by asserting, 'We always have had different images of what the Anglican Communion is and should be.'

Augustine of Hippo: Confessions. Part of the series "Religious Classics with Michael Himes." Discussion of Augustine's life and his classic writing that is a central text of Christian theological tradition and a spiritual guide for countless people. Study guide available. (25 min.)

The Authority of the Laity. Verna Dozier on tape. A four-session program with study guide. It is recommended that each participant have a copy of the book by the same name and read the appropriate chapter before each session. Need one to two hours for each session. Total tape running time is 60 min.

Celebrating God's Love: Children and the Eucharist. Aimed at adults; provides an explanation for the admittance of children to communion at Baptism. Helpful for parents preparing to have a child baptized. 30 min.

Celebration of discipline: the path to spiritual growth. Richard J. Foster, 1984. 2 tape set: 2 programs on each tape, each 50 min. in length. (Diocese also has 4 copies of the book by the same title.)

Families Matter. Produced by the Diocese of Los Angeles. A good discussion starter on the issue of the modern family, and what the Church can do to strengthen it. High school and up. 30 min.

From Christ to Constantine: The Trial and Testimony of the Early Church. The early church survived and spread despite intense persecution. Its experience can help guide us today as we seek to be faithful to god. Six half-hour programs, for six or twelve sessions. Leader's guide.

Getting Ready for the Kingdom: The Cultural Captivity of the Church. Produced and presented by Bishop Michael Marshall of the Anglican Institute. Attempts to answer the questions: "How can the church live in the world and not be engulfed by the cultural attitudes of society? What are the sources of authority for Christians?" Five 20-minute segments; with study guide. This program is certain to stimulate discussion.

Hebrew Roots, Christian Beginnings. A 12-part video series that provides a complete study in the development of Christianity from its origins in the ancient Hebrew religion, with emphasis on the religious beliefs of Jesus and the changes he brought about in what has become our own Christian heritage and our modern understanding of God.

This series is suitable for use in an adult catechumenate program, as part of an adult confirmation class, or for anyone wishing a fresh presentation of Christianity. There is something here for all adult learners.

Each tape contains three half-hour segments. Comes with study guide.

*****Living the Questions 2.0;** an introduction to progressive Christianity. ©2007 livingthequestions.com Three DVD set. Each DVD offers 7 units of study. Flexible session format allows for a variety of study settings, from one hour to two hour time frames that can be expanded. 20 minute video segments include conversations with leading voices of faith, sermon and lecture clips, digital stories illustrating aspects of an evolving faith, and concrete spiritual practices. Session guides are available in print or by email from the Diocesan Office.

From the disclaimer: This study is *not* for * those whose personal faith requires them to believe that the Bible is the inerrant and infallible word of God; * those who believe that the doctrines set forth by the early church are sacrosanct and not to be questioned; * those whose eternal salvation depends on their unswerving commitment to the above; * those who believe the reason the mainline churches in Europe, North America, and Australia/New Zealand have been losing members and influence for generations is because they haven't been teaching "orthodox" Christianity or preaching the true Gospel.

Catherine Waynick, Bishop of Indianapolis, in response to the Bishop's Annual Conference on Stewardship in the Diocese of Kansas March 11, 2000 An ideal resource for reflection at a Vestry retreat, Stewardship Ministry Team study session, or as training for the entire congregation in an adult forum or in preparation for the annual pledge drive.
